




Bethlehem Peace Light Ceremony

NRA Range Safety Officer Course

January 18, 2025

An NRA Certified Range Safety Officer will be able to organize, conduct, and supervise safe shooting activities and range operations. A participant **must be 21 years old or older,** attend the entire course, participate in the discussions and practical exercises, and achieve a final exam score of 90% or higher.

For all Troop and Crew shoots, an NRA instructor **AND** an NRA RSO is required. If Troops and Crews have an RSO, the organizations will only be required to find an NRA instructor current in the firearm intended to shoot. There will be no firearms or ammunition in the class beyond those which the instructor will provide for demonstration.

The Great Southwest Council is encouraging all units to include "Scouting for Food" in their plans for the upcoming year. This is a long-standing Scouting America service project tradition.

What is Scouting for Food?

Scouting for Food began in St. Louis as an Eagle Project in 1981. He coordinated efforts to drop off bags at houses in his community and pick up donations the next week and deliver the nonperishable goods to a local food bank. It was such a success - the Greater St. Louis Council picked up on the plan and made it a council-wide event. A few years later - BSA National picked up on it and it became a Nation-wide service project and thousands of Scouts went door to door and collected millions of pounds of food for their communities. Over the years - it has become more of an individual council or unit project and the collection methods have changed - but it is still an important and recognizable part of Scouting
