## **RECHARTERING UPDATE**

With the New Year upon us, it's time to look at the projects of last year that need to be finished in the new year. Foremost on the mind of a Council Commissioner is unit renewal (the new term for the old recharter process). We've made good progress in the process that kicked off on November 1st. Almost 60% (51/89) of our units have started the process, and 1/3rd (31/89) of all units have been Posted, finishing the process. Our focus now is on the 40% of units that haven't started the process. That 40% represents 38 units. We'll be reaching out to the Key 3 of each of those units to see what we can do to help them get the process underway. As a reminder, here are the three key factors for achieving a quick and successful unit renewal:

- 1. Does your unit have someone filling the positions required for renewal? (see below for what those positions are for each type unit)
- 2. Have those individuals renewed their individual membership for 2025? As of 1/1/25, members in the required positions need to have renewed their membership for 2025.
- 3. Is their Youth Protection Training current?

If the answer to all three questions is "YES!", then completing unit renewal should be pretty easy! The first step in the online tool will check those items. After that, the tool asks the unit to verify the info on their Be A Scout 'pin', select a method of payment, and submit the package. Submitting the

annual charter agreement by email, snail mail, or dropping off a copy at the Scout Office will be the last step in the process that will allow your unit to be "Posted."

Here are the required positions for each type unit:

- Pack: COR\*, Committee Chair, Cubmaster, two Committee Members, and one Den Leader (must be a Den Leader, not an Assistant)
- Troop: COR\*, Committee Chair, Scoutmaster, two Committee Members
- Crew: COR\*, Committee Chair, Crew Advisor, two Committee Members

\*COR can also be Committee Chair OR a Committee Member; cannot be both. No other mandatory positions can hold multiple positions

Welcome to 2025 and Advancement changes you need to know about!

Scouting America is constantly morphing and National has updated our Guide to Advancement (GTA) for 2025! This resource impacts every age and program. When you open the new GTA, be sure the Green Cover has 2025 printed on it. Sometimes computers think it's funny to show us a prior version that they saved.

This site shows many Advancement resources including the most recent Eagle Workbook (Feb 2023), the Eagle Application (Dec 2024), and all the Merit Badges with their updates (Jan 2025). The GTA is first.


